It is a monumental task including many hours with the Handbook revision committee as well as other AIS members who sent information and revisions of chapters or participated in Zoom meetings. Their input has been vital to the revision process.

While we all wanted and hoped the revision would have been available several years ago (maybe even 5 years) – so much has changed. Five years ago, we wanted a print copy and the same size pages/cover we have in the current edition. We all know the computer/laptop/tablet/phone purchased five years ago is totally outdated. I mention this because rather than having the expense of printed binders and inserts on hand – we can print on demand. Viewing the handbook on a laptop or tablet is much easier than it would have been several years ago.
