I will continue to communicate with AIS Sections and all Regions to encourage them to provide links to the Photo Contest as well. A Google search will take one directly to the contest website.

I ask that the following motion be considered:

"That announcement of contest winners and honorable mentions be completed on websites in as timely of a manner as is reasonably feasible. That website interfaces and/or links be enabled as is reasonable possible, with an eventual goal of having them as seamless as possible."

Anyone with ideas for improvement of the photo contest, please do send them to me. Each year I am looking for new judges with photography experience. If you know of someone to recommend, please send me your recommendation.
