## SPRING 2010 YOUTH REPORT

As of my last report from Tom, there are 170 youth members of AIS. This is down slightly from a year ago, but the attrition is mostly due to youth members reaching the age of 19. I expect the numbers to rise once many shows are held as is usually the case. Tom has been wonderful in sending me new youth registrations as soon as he receives them so that the youth members are contacted within a week or less.

There are youth members in every region except 10, 11, 16 and 19. The largest representation of youth members is in Region 18. Currently there are two Classroom Iris Projects, both in Region 13.
