We currently have 285 subscribers (up from 280 in Nov '09, 120 of which are renewals, up from 108 in Nov '09) and have received \$16637.00 in subscription revenues since the program inception from a total of 812 subscriptions representing 1774 years worth of access. Additionally there are 5 foreign registrars and two committee chairs with complimentary access.
