Over the winter I did some research on Print on Demand. The results were shared with John Jones for use with the R&I.

I also got some information on duplication of searchable CDs. Companies that produce the CDs want to make 1,000 copies or more. Fewer than that are prohibitively expensive. There are a number of cheap software programs we could get to do them ourselves, but we would need someone with the time and expertise to take this on. Given the rapid movement of the general public to electronic formats, this may be worth exploring. The cost to produce are extremely low compare to hard copy printing.

On a happier note, I have one new volunteer to work on compiling the Hager chronicles.

I would like to request that a complete set of Bulletins be made available to the committee members for research purposes. I will assume the responsibility for keeping track of them and sending them out to committee members.

Upcoming projects -
