Currently there are 456 youth members, an increase of 91 since my last report. The majority of our youth are enrolled in Classroom Iris Programs. There are 6 CIPs in Region 14, 4 CIPs in Region 18 and 1 CIP in Region 4 (which consists of three 4th grade classrooms).

We had wonderful participation in the Coloring Contest (119 entrants), and the Ackerman Essay Contest (56 entrants), most of them enrolled in the CIPs. Their teachers are using these contests to enrich the art and english curriculum.

I am happy to report that the 3 young ladies chosen for the Clarke Cosgrove Memorial Award for Youth Achievement will be attending the convention: winner Amberlee Pick, 1st runner up Hope Winzer and 2nd runner up Glory Winzer.

These young people, and many others who are involved in the AIS Youth Program, are successful due to the mentoring of adults in their lives, whether it is parents, teachers or other caring adults. Too many of our young members are not taken under the wing of an interested adult so that they may learn and appreciate our favorite flower.
