Currently, there are only 126 Youth members. I believe this is due to the Covid 19 virus which forced most kids to engage in distance learning. There are only 37 youth members enrolled in the Classroom Iris Program, one in Region 14 and 2 in Region 18. The largest CIP, which was in Region 14, has not renewed - Coarsegold Elementary School, where there were 2 classes and an after school program. I am hoping that I will see their renewal very soon, because they were one of the most active of our CIPs.
